# Online Safety Guide

Children's use of the internet is becoming more mobile and interactive offering young people more opportunities to interact and meet new people, so it's never been more important to make sure you are helping your child stay safe in the digital world.

## Checklist

### ✓ Put yourself in control

Make use of the parental controls on your home broadband and any internet-enabled devices. You can find out how at your broadband provider's website or by visiting [internetmatters.org](http://internetmatters.org).

### Search safely

Use safe search engines such as [swiggle.org](http://swiggle.org)

- ✓ or [kids-search.com](http://kids-search.com). Safe search settings can also be activated on Google and other search engines as well as YouTube. You can find out more at [google.co.uk/safetycentre](http://google.co.uk/safetycentre).

### Agree boundaries

- ✓ Be clear what your child can and can't do online - where they can use the internet, how much time they can spend online, the sites they can visit and the type of information they can share. Agree with your child when they can have a mobile phone or tablet.

79% of 7-11 year-olds said they would tell their parent or carer if something worried them online.

### ✓ Explore together

The best way to find out what your child is doing online is to ask them to tell you about it. Put the family computer in a communal area so you can see what sites they're visiting and share with them.

### ✓ Check if it's suitable

The age ratings that come with games, apps, films and social networks are a good guide to whether they're suitable for your child. The minimum age limit is 13 for several social networking sites, including Facebook and Instagram.

## Sports day and the Commonwealth Games

Thank you to those of you who were able to spend sports day with us this year, it was fabulous to be able to have parents with us at the event and I hope you enjoyed it as much as we did.

This summer, with the Commonwealth Games being hosted in Birmingham, Staverton have been exploring the different sports, countries involved and values needed to be a Commonwealth Games athlete and have used the games as inspiration to become more active.

We launched our Commonwealth games journey with an assembly back in June, and as a school we have been taking part in the Northamptonshire Sport Commonwealth Games Active Class Challenge using active learning minutes to travel to the different stadiums being used for the games and then trying out some new sporting activities. Active learning is so important for children, and this challenge has helped increased the amount of physical activity that we are doing each day, inspiring us as adults and the children to be more active.

Sports Crew has also been embracing the Commonwealth Games spirit, using the Commonwealth Games Active Challenges in their lunchtime sessions, with the 'Howler Throw' currently being the favourite offered. It has been great to see even more children being inspired to take part in Sports Crew's active lunch sessions and our Daily Mile through this link to the Commonwealth Games.

With the Games being so close to Staverton, we decided to welcome the Games further by using it as a theme for our Sports Day. Each class learnt about one of the Commonwealth Games' countries and created a class flag that represented an aspect of that country, helping us learn about the countries that take part, and I am sure you will agree that they looked fantastic.

Nutrition has been our science focus this half term, exploring the different food groups and designing a healthy meal. This linked will to our PSHE topic on changing bodies.

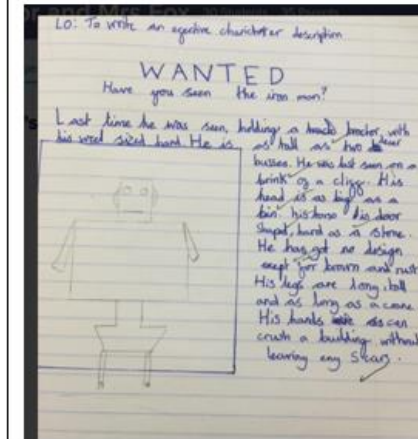
We have enjoyed learning about how Hindu's worship when they are at home as well as when visiting temples. We enjoyed looking at the objects on a puja tray.
